September seems a long time ago but it was quite a busy time for the group.

Jenny Bowden took part in the Wirksworth Art Trail and Anthea Stephenson and Louise McNiff both had work in the Derbyshire Open, where Louise won the Derbyshire County Council Award for her piece, "Dark Skies"

From July- September, **Cath Dunn** had work on display at No.28,Belper and was a Premier Artist at Art in the Gardens at Sheffield Botanical Gardens. In addition to this she was involved in the "Eight Women in Print" exhibition which took place in The Bessemer café gallery on Ecclesall Road.

Others taking part were Angela Harpham, Caroline Quincy, Jan Slater, Judith Webster, Katherine Rhodes, Linda Green and Mair Richards.

All are members of the Professional Practice Group of Sheffield Printmakers which has recently been looking at a blog concerned with printing using aluminium tape. Beyond this, **Angela Harpham** took part in The Kommune and Frontier Green City Postcard Exhibition in August; an exhibition at Totley Library from September to late December; Fronteer Open at 35 Chapel Walk from the end of November to the beginning of December, Totley Library's Christmas Fayre and the Art House Christmas Market .

At the earlier Summer Market at the Art House the Sheffield Printmakers had a group Stall and **Mair Richards, Sally Brooks** and **Anthea Stephenson** all had individual stalls.

Also in the Summer, **Katherine Rhodes** had work in the North Lincs Open Print Exhibition at the Rope Walk Gallery in Barton-on-Humber and **Rosemary Watson** had miniprints from her research project included in a touring exhibitions which visited Bonn-Bad Godesburg and Bad Ems in Germany, Pineda de Mar, Spain ,Eye in Suffolk which are currently in Bages, France. She also had other prints on exhibition at the Djanogly Gallery, Nottingham University.

Rosemary was also one of the six members of Sheffield Printmakers who took part in the 20:20 Print Exchange, organised by Hot Bed Press in Salford. Over 400 artists took part from over 40 studios/groups from around the world including Canada, Denmark, Iceland, Ireland ,Russia and,of course,the UK .

Sheffield Printmakers members taking part were, Linda Green, Val Vernon, Rosemary Watson, Jan Beautyman, Jo Pye and Louise Westerman.

Every artist has to produce 24 copies of a 20x20cm print.(Paper size, the print can be any size.) In return he/she receives a box containing a random selection of other people's work + one copy of their own. This was the first time that I had done this and I was a bit daunted at first, but once I'd made that the plate it was less of a chore than I had thought and looking at the other work we received gave me greater confidence in my own work.

Linda asked us all to write our thoughts on the experience and I have attached a copy of Jan's as an example.

Our thanks must go to Linda for organising it all and to Louise for a lovely afternoon of coffee and cake when we received our boxes. Louise also had screen prints and ceramics in the Winter Show at the Old Lock up Gallery in Cromford and will be doing a workshop there on Sunday March 8th called "Abstracting the Landscape Using Monoprint Techniques"

At present Jan is looking into the possibility of hosting the 20:20 exhibition here in Sheffield later in the year. If we can do this it will be good publicity for Sheffield Printmakers.

And, of course, we had our annual Off the Press exhibition at The Art House.
